#### TUESDAY SEPT. 2nd, 2025 @ 8:55AM -10AM

On Tuesday, September 2nd, 2025 at 8:55am, Grade 1 - 7 students should report to their last year's classroom to be welcomed back from their summer vacation. New students will report to the library on the first day (the library faces the alley just past the main office entrance and flagpole). All students will be dismissed at 10am. All parents are invited to an informal get together near the playground from 9-10am. This will give you a chance to meet and catch up with friends and neighbours.

From Wednesday, September 3rd to Monday, September 8th students will report to their "homeroom" groupings. Information about homerooms and locations will go home by Tuesday, September 2nd.

The learning intention of the first week is to continue working on our "Me to We" Journey. We will explore the many ways we can grow, work, and play together at Brentwood Park. We will revisit the school motto of "Care for Ourselves, Care for Others, and Care for our Community" and work on explicitly noticing, naming and nurturing ways we can support ourselves, others and our community. Students will start and end each day in their "homeroom" and will have opportunities throughout the week to engage in station activities with various teachers.

We hope to be able to assign students to their new classrooms on Tuesday, September 9th. Students entering Kindergarten **do not** come to school on Tuesday, Sept. 2nd. #### Get outside and play

Physical activity is a necessary requirement for optimal health - and the benefits are even greater if you can do it outdoors

Regular physical activity in childhood and adolescence helps to develop cardiovascular fitness, muscle strength and bone density, and being outdoors is known to improve mental health.

There are many benefits to unstructured, outside play. When children and youth spend time outside, they:

- 1. Sit less, move more and play longer key to cardiovascular health and fitness.
- 2. Have healthier eyes spending more time outside reduces nearsightedness risks.
- 3. Sleep better sunlight helps regulate sleep hormones and sleep patterns.
- 4. Enjoy improved mood exercise reduces symptoms of anxiety and depression.
- 5. Feel more connected to nature experience calm and develop mindfulness.
